Welcome to Term 1

Welcome to all our returning Catechists and new recruits for Catholic Special Religious Education (SRE). I look forward to meeting you at our practical training courses and events throughout this New Year.

This year, SRE classes will start just as Lent begins our journey to Easter (Ash Wed 14 Feb). Please see the article on Lent (pages 6 & 7) and Easter/Term dates to note (page 20).

"Initial and ongoing training" as per our Archbishop's annual assurance to NSW Education Dept

Keeping kids interested = keeping on track = more chance of lasting memories of hope and joy

Your 2017 feedback on our revised **Level 1 (Basic) training** was very positive, e.g. for "Using the approved curriculum" in age-appropriate and engaging ways, "Classroom management" and "Resources".

For all those who have been enquiring, our **Level 2 (Intermediate) training** has been revised and refined over the course of 2017. This will be running in venues around the Archdiocese. Please book. Similarly, we will be revising our **Level 3 (Advanced) training** this year. See pages 17, 18, 19 for course descriptions, dates and training venues around Sydney.

Level 1 (Basic) training requirements for new catechists and helpers:

Before entering a classroom as a new Catechist or Helper, complete:

Unit 1: SRE Safeguarding Module, Role of the Catechist in the Church & Public School

Before teaching a class as a new Catechist, complete:

Unit 2: Using the Approved Curriculum

Before starting your second year of service, complete the remaining Level 1 units:

Unit 3: Classroom Management

Unit 4: The Bible

Unit 5: Classroom skills, Awareness of the Child in the Classroom

Tailoring training – note to Parish SRE Coordinators:

If any of your new recruits find it extremely difficult to attend face-to-face training, please contact your Area Faith Education Officer (FEO) to discuss other training options, such as, arranging a convenient time or enrolling in online training. That said, the unit on "Using the Approved Curriculum" must be done face-to-face given its "hands on" nature. CCD staff also need an opportunity to get to know new recruits to tailor support and direction if needs be.

Renewals for Working with Children Checks (WWCC):

For those who first applied for a WWCC in 2013, renewals will be due this year. You will receive a renewal reminder via email. Your parish, which knows your WWCC number and expiry date, will help with reminders and renewals.

From the Director

Concern:

New marriage law and teaching the Archbishop's approved Catholic SRE curriculum

If you follow the Teacher's Manual, you are following the Archbishop's approved curriculum. Do not give your own opinion on same-sex marriage nor enter into conversation on the topic with children.

Aim:

We want to safeguard students and safeguard you.

Direction:

It is <u>not</u> your role to answer same-sex marriage questions from children (or within their hearing).

Recent social discussion and media attention may have put the "sex" word into some children's vocabulary; however, whilst they may use the word, they do not all know what the word means; and, importantly, it is <u>not</u> your role to tell them, even if they do seem to know; therefore,

☑ Please direct children's same-sex marriage questions or comments to parents/caregivers

How to direct same-sex marriage questions/comments from children:

"Today we are talking about ... (e.g. creation; the sacraments; what the People of God, the Church, know marriage to be). Your question/comment is a 'home topic' not an 'SRE classroom topic'. Ask your parents/It is best to talk with your parents about it."

Feedback/Reporting:

If any students do bring up same-sex marriage, report it to the front office along with what you said to direct their question/comment appropriately. Then, phone or email the CCD so we can keep a record, discuss the matter with you and, if needs be, offer any help or suggestions.

Tips for Parish Catechist Co-ordinators

_	a Parish SRE Catechist Co-ordinator is a big role and each of us does it in our own way. However, are some tips that have worked well in my parish:
□ details	Think big plan small! (In other words, have a vision but ensure that you pay attention to all the s – this will save you trouble in the longer term.)
	Have one or two key people who are passionate, organised and willing!
	Plan well ahead: start your planning for the next term (or next year) a term or two beforehand.
	In conjunction with your team of catechists, take time to review the current year and to reflect on changes you would like to make. What worked? What didn't work? What could be done better? his information down and use it as a guide.
□ signific terms.	Keep a record of key dates – Catechist Sunday, school terms and holidays, public holidays, cant parish events, sacramental programs, dates when catechists have planned holidays during

ensure	Make sure that you know what the most up-to-date requirements are for new and returning hists. □ encou	Keep copies of the course training calendar handy and ensure that your catechists are lraged to attend.
□ Educa	Keep a contact list with the names, telephone numbers and email addresses of your Faith tion Officer, catechists and helpers, schools and SRE co-ordinators and any other key people.
□ email ı	If using email, set up a group distribution list. Make sure that you remember to contact any non-members of your team another way.
will ne	Order your Teachers' Manuals and Student Activity Books well ahead to ensure that each and catechist is well equipped to start the year. Don't wait to get class numbers - estimate what you ed based on the current number of students and then add a 10% contingency. You can always extra books as needed.
	Ask for help in completing administrative tasks: many parishioners will not volunteer to teach but lling to order and organise classroom books, prepare music, deliver things or be a contact person - on't have to do it all!
resour	The mission of the catechists is a vital one but can be a bit 'under the radar 'at times. Think about you and your team need from your parish and ask for it. This might be practical assistance, more ces, a dedicated catechist space/storage, IT help or whatever. Teaching our parish children in schools is a big job – share the load.
□ achie\	Having shared the load, remember to share the joy. Let your parish members know what is being yed and look for ways to celebrate the mission of Special Religious Education.

Easter - Our Lenten Journey

A Reflection you could use at your catechist meeting.....

Lent is a traditional time to reflect on our life journey, to ask ourselves once again,

- "Where am I going?" and
- □ "How will I get there?"

Leader: This Lenten season we are called to journey towards God. Let us reflect on how to travel wisely and well, confident of God's companionship along the way.

Opening song: 'Companions on the Journey' by Carey Landry. (You could use other reflective music)

Scripture Reading: Mark 6: 7-13

Then he (Jesus) made a tour round the villages, teaching. Then he summoned the twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff - no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic'. And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and the people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance, and they cast out many evil spirits, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.

Leader: Take a moment now to reflect in silence on the word you have just heard.

- If you can't take a walking stick or beggar's bag for your journey, what will you take and why?.... pause
- Which of these road signs best describe your current 'mode of operation' on your journey: Yield, Detour, Stop, Railroad Crossing, Curve Ahead? Why is this so?pause
- How will you use your travelling time with your class this Lent? ... pause

Invite spontaneous responses to these reflections from participants or you may like to use the following. Participant could make the response: Lord hear our prayer, after each.

- That each of us will use our gifts and talents to help one another on our journey, Let us pray to the Lord.
- That we will remember to talk to God about the joys and sorrows of our journey, Let us pray to the Lord.
- That we will always ask God to guide us when faced with difficult choices, Let us pray to the Lord.
- For all the people in our world who are forgotten along the way, Let us pray to the Lord.

Teaching Lent and Holy Week Lessons

Lent is a time the Church prepares to celebrate the great feast of Easter. Use a purple prayer cloth – purple because we are preparing for a feast. In Holy week we remember how much Jesus loved us. The students will learn that Jesus died for us on Good Friday and rose to new life on Easter Sunday. This is taught across the years with sensitivity in an age appropriate manner. The scope and sequence in your Teacher's Manual gives you details of what is taught in each year level. A section is reproduced below.

Dear Eastern Area Catechists,

One of the greatest philosophers who ever lived, Aristotle, asks and answers the very question of life's existence: "What is the essence of life? To serve others and to do good." Our fundamental nature and our very existence, is to serve others and do good. This is consistent with the Catholic Church's teaching of the understanding of life: "To know, love and serve God, in order to be happy with God in Heaven". How we know, love and serve God is through service to others.

Some of the most reasoned minds have restated and invested their lives in the service of others, with a heart set on Charity (God who is Love). St Mother Teresa of Calcutta says, "I am a little pencil in the hand of a writing God who is sending a love letter to the world."

The philosopher and poet of The Prophet, Kahlil Gibran, reminds us that giving of material possessions is far less rewarding than when one gives of themselves. Dear Southern Area Catechists,

Welcome to the New Year and your new catechist class. Starting a new year with a new class can be daunting. How will I manage the class? What if I do not know enough about my faith? What will I teach? These are some of the things catechists often worry about.

The NEW CATECHIST TRAINING COURSES will help you gain basic skills in preparation and planning your lessons using the approved curriculum. They provide an opportunity for you to learn more about our Catholic faith and how to present it to students at an age appropriate level. These courses also provide opportunities to observe and discuss teaching strategies that are really creative ways of avoiding discipline problems. You will find details of these courses in this newsletter and on our webpage. It is also a good idea to plan your lessons early and if possible 'talk through' the first few lessons with a more



experienced catechist. Three sisters Geraldine, Angela, and Mary Anne (pictured above) know the value of this as they are catechists in the same parish.

- A well planned lesson usually means fewer discipline problems.
- After each lesson take the time to reflect on how you went.
- Get to know the names of the students as soon as possible.
- Use name tags and make a class roll.

This year SRE classes start just as Lent begins and we will celebrate Easter on 1st April – two weeks before the end of Term 1. In your Teacher's Manual you will notice that the Christ Our Light and Life curriculum has Lent and Holy Week lessons within some of the first eight lessons. Please refer to the Scope and Sequence chart in this newsletter to ensure you teach this topic at an age appropriate level.

All new catechists are required to have a verified WWCC and attend Level 1.1 of the Basic Training Course before entering a school and Level 1.2 before teaching a class. New catechists are then to complete the remaining three days of the Basic Training Course within their first year of being a catechist.


