So why did Jesus have to go away if he could do such amazing things? This is where the Pentecost lessons come in.


At home, we want our kids to grow up to be good and loving adults and to relate to them as such. How much more does God want to be in a mature relationship with us!

Level 2 (Intermediate) training course

The revised Level 2 training course is where we help you really hone "teaching for learning" skills. Feedback from this course is extremely positive. Here is what some Catechists have written:



Behaviour management and special needs in your classroom

If the behaviour of a student is of concern, please talk firstly with the school and your Catechist Co-ordinator. Schools are grateful to know if a student is acting "out of character" or misbehaving consistently. You can rightly say that you are concerned for the children's safety and ask if the school has a management plan for any particular students.

The current SRE "Scripture" Implementation Procedures state that SRE teachers (Catechists) are to be given "any special information, such as disability or special needs, which might affect the health, behaviour or performance of particular students." Students with learning difficulties, such as attention disorders or autism, should have school management plans and, in certain cases, have an assigned teacher's aide to help the student in class, including SRE.

The above is covered in CCD's revised Level 1.1 SRE Safeguarding Module training course. Your CCD Faith Education Officer is available to help you and your Catechist Co-ordinator with any matters that are not readily addressed by your school at the local level.

Year of Youth

Year of Youth

The Australian Bishops have identified the liturgical year of 2018 as a national Year of Youth. The Year of Youth invites us to focus on the reconnection and renewal of a new generation of young people in the life of the Church.

demands a good dose of courage, a readiness to trade in the sofa for a pair of walking shoes and to set out on new and uncharted paths, to blaze trails that open up new horizons capable of spreading joy, born of God's love and wells up in your hearts with every act of mercy. To take the path of the "craziness" of our God, who teaches us to encounter him in the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the sick, the friend in trouble, the prisoner, the refugee and the migrant, and our neighbours who feel abandoned. Eileen O'Connor

Eileen O'Connor is a 'local girl' who is an inspiration, especially for young people, during this Year of Youth.

A SAINT-IN-WAITING? Elleen O'Connor - dubbed 'Little Mother' by her congregation - is considered by many to be a saint-in-waiting.

Eileen suffered a crippling back injury as a toddler and died on 10th January 1921, aged just 28 years. Her body was found to be incorrupt when it was exhumed from Randwick Cemetery for reinterment in the chapel at Our Lady's Home, Coogee, 15 years later.

As Bishop Terry Brady, Auxiliary Bishop of Sydney, said some years ago, "To many of us she is already an uncanonised saint of our Church."

Our Archbishop Anthony Fisher has recently appointed an official postulator to continue the process for Eileen to be officially recognised as a saint of the Church.

Eileen's legacy ranks among the great and enduring social works of Caroline Chisholm and Saint Mary MacKillop. Eileen co-founded the

mission of Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor, who over the past 100 years have provided in-home healthcare, advocacy and friendship for the poor and marginalised throughout Sydney, Brisbane, Newcastle and Wollongong.



Pope Francis encourages Catechists ...



Missionary disciples: Pope Francis thanks and encourages Catechists

Last July, Pope Francis sent his message to participants in the First International Symposium on Catechesis in Buenos Aires.

The Pope opened his message with a quote from his namesake, St. Francis of Assisi. He noted that when one of St. Francis' followers asked to be taught how to preach, the saint responded by saying: "Brother, when we visit the sick, help children and give to the poor, we are already preaching."

"In this beautiful lesson is enclosed the vocation and task of the catechist," Pope Francis said, explaining that catechesis is not simply a job or a task external to the person of the catechist. Rather, "their whole life revolves around this mission," he said, noting that to be a catechist is "a vocation of service in the Church, which is received as a gift on the part of the Lord and must in turn be transmitted."

To do this, one must return to the first encounter with Christ that changed their life. This moment, Francis said, is "the fundamental announcement that must resonate again and again in the life of the Christian, and even more in the one who is called to announce and teach the faith."

A catechist is also someone who journeys both from and with Christ, He said. "They are not a person who starts from their own ideas and preferences, but who allows themselves to look to him, to this gaze that makes their heart burn."

The more that Jesus is the centre of our lives, the more he teaches us to go out of ourselves, Pope Francis said, able to be close to others.

"This dynamism of love is like the movement of the heart," and Jesus himself gives us an example of how to live this when he retreats to pray, and then "immediately goes to the encounter of those who are hungry and thirsty for God".

Pope Francis closed his speech by thanking catechists for their work, "above all because you walk with the People of God," and encouraged them "to be joyful messengers, guardians of the good and the beauty that shines forth in the faithful life of the missionary disciple."

The Fruits of the Holy Spirit


This is a reflection to use at your catechist meeting in Term 2.

Am I able to recognise both my strengths & my weaknesses?



Teaching Today's Teenagers

Throughout history the church has always known that religious education was a life-long process. The faithful of all age groups were taught through sermons, travelling preachers, catechumenates, and mystery and morality plays. Only a small part of the population received formal religious education. It is only over the last hundred years that schools have been set up for the education of all children. In Australia this saw both secular and religious education become part of the classroom program. We have seen the age at which a child leaves school stretch from 12 to 14 to 18.

Interestingly, during the same period, this group of over 12s also became identified as a separate age group called "teenagers". This age sub-group has been developed, and to a large extent exploited, by the media, fashion, music, entertainment and leisure industries. Catechists meet teenagers in high schools and find themselves in situations similar to the early missionaries. These teachers are trying to build links between the culture of the teenagers and the culture and heritage of the church - a culture of which they may be largely unaware or to which they may have little access."

Catechists need to understand the forces at work within the teenage culture so they can identify elements in that culture which may help introduce these young people to their religious heritage. Today's teenagers live in a time of unprecedented change, many of them have been cut off from a heritage which may seem alien to them but to which they are heirs. Just like the early missionaries, catechists are working in an area where the potential harvest is great but the harvesters are few. We are always looking for catechists to teach high school special religious education classes. So, is the lot of the scripture teacher in high school more stressful than it used to be? Are teenagers today really more difficult than those of the last generation? Should we just give up on them?

Here are a few comments on "teenagers" collected over the years:

The young people of today think of nothing but themselves. They have no reverence for parents or old age; They are impatient of all restraint; They talk as if they alone know everything. As for the girls, they are foolish, and immodest and unwomanly in speech, behaviour and dress. **Peter the Hermit 1083 A.D.**

Our young men have grown slothful. There is not a single honourable occupation for which they will toil night and day. Without strength, without energy, they add nothing to the gifts with which they were born - then they complain of their lot. **Seneca 1 A.D**.


Youth today now love luxury; they show disrespect for elders. They no longer rise when their elders enter the room. They contradict their parents, chatter before company.....and tyrannise their teachers. **Socrates 400 B.C.**

I see no hope for the future of our people if they are dependent on the frivolous youth of today, for all youth are reckless beyond words....When I was young, we were taught to be discreet and respectful of elders, but the present youth are impatient of restraint. **Hesiod 800 B.C.**



The Prayer Space is an appropriate way of reinforcing the time and place for prayer, the Liturgical Season and the presence of the Mass.

Early in Term One a number of parishes invited me to speak at their respective catechist recruitment drives. Thank you to you all for raising the awareness of our work. Often interested parishioners do not come forward at the end of each Mass but approach later. This has been the case for two of these parishes.

As you are aware, Unit 1.1 Safeguarding and Role of the Catechist (prior to entering a class) and Unit 1.2: Using the Authorised Curriculum (prior to teaching a class), are essential requirements for Catholic SRE teachers in public schools. Keep in mind that the remaining Units 1.3 to 1.5 must be completed in the first year of teaching. You will find dates and locations of these courses in the current newsletter on pages 18 and 19.

The Eastern Area Mass will be hosted by Randwick Parish, on Wednesday 20 June, commencing with Mass at 10am, followed by lunch. You are all invited to join us and bring some food to share.


