

Sacraments of service

FOCUS

1. The Catholic Church celebrates Holy Orders as a sacrament at the service of communion. It includes 3 degrees - Bishops, priests and deacons.
2. Bishops, priests and deacons act in the person of Christ, leading worship, administering the sacraments, guiding and sanctifying the Church.
3. Marriage involves the unconditional and total lifelong self-giving of each spouse to the other.
4. The Our Father is the prayer Jesus taught us.

In these lessons your child may have:

- identified symbols and rituals associated with the sacraments of service;
- listed some of the ways a parish priest serves the Church and wider community;
- considered and suggested the qualities needed for a marriage relationship and for family life;
- discussed the symbols and rituals associated with a marriage ceremony;
- recalled occasions when they have prayed and discussed the nature of their prayers;
- listened and responded to the prayer Jesus taught us – the *Our Father*.

John 13:3-9, 12-16

When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. 1. Talk with your child about marriage, the actual ceremony and the happiness and joy you have shared in married life.
2. Look at your photo albums. Talk with your child about the married couples in them.
3. Discuss the role of your parish priest and what he does for your parish.
4. Pray the Our Father together as a family.
5. Write a prayer of praise or thanksgiving for all the good that happens in your family.
6. Choose one of the psalms from the Book of Psalms and read it together as a family and discuss what you think the author is saying.



