

The Pentecost Novena is the first of all novenas, nine days of prayer.

After Jesus' Ascension into heaven, He commanded His disciples to come together in the upper room to devote themselves to constant prayer (Acts 1:14). They prayed for nine days before receiving the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

On May 4, 1897, Pope Leo XIII proclaimed: *"We decree and command that throughout the whole Catholic Church, this year and in every subsequent year, a novena shall take place before Whit-Sunday (Pentecost), in all parish churches."* (Encyclical On the Holy Spirit, 13)

Let us join the Church in praying a novena for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit this Pentecost – beginning on Friday 22 May, the day after Ascension Thursday.

Pentecost Sequence: Veni, Sancte Spiritus (Come, Holy Spirit)

The Pentecost sequence can be recited daily in preparation for Pentecost. (The prayer is sung at Mass on Pentecost).

Holy Spirit, Lord of light, From the clear celestial height Thy pure beaming radiance give. Come, thou Father of the poor, Come with treasures which endure; Come, thou light of all that live! Thou, of all consolers best, Thou, the soul's delightful guest, Dost refreshing peace bestow; Thou in toil art comfort sweet; Pleasant coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. Light immortal, light divine, Visit thou these hearts of thine, And our inmost being fill: If thou take thy grace away, Nothing pure in man will stay; All his good is turned to ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour thy dew; Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. Thou, on us who evermore Thee confess and thee adore, With thy sevenfold gifts descend: Give us comfort when we die; Give us life with thee on high; Give us joys that never end. "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth..."

Why am I a catechist? By Eunice Woo (Eastwood Parish)

I grew up as a Protestant Christian while attending a Methodist girls' school for ten years. I was fortunately blessed to hear about Jesus and the scriptures in the school chapel every week.

On the 25th October 2015, my Protestant husband and I became Catholics and received the Sacrament of Confirmation from His Grace, Archbishop Anthony Fisher. We owe much of our conversion to Fr. Anthony Bernard, Parish Priest at St Joseph's, Camperdown.

I am truly blessed to have Jesus in my life. He is definitely the greatest gift ever. There are many people who still do not know Him. Jesus words in Matthew 9:37, *"The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few,"* has been in my heart ever since I was a child. I desire to share my faith so that more people will come to know and love Jesus.

One Sunday at Mass, I watched a video inviting parishioners to become catechist's. The Holy Spirit stirred within me. I wanted to join the ministry but did not know how as I did not have any experience. Thankfully, full training and support was provided and I started out as a catechist helper.

Since joining as a catechist in 2018, I have taught almost 50 students. I continue to see some of my scripture students and their parents in church and at the local shopping centre. It is a joy to teach the children about the sacraments, how to read the Bible and so much more.

I have witnessed a transformation in my students who were initially not interested and have since increased in their faith and understanding. Jesus has come alive in their hearts.

Our students hearts are open to receive the Word of God, we just need to reach out and share the goodness of the Lord to them today, especially in their formative years.

Working With Children Checks

Renewals in 2020

Working with Children Checks are to be renewed every five years. Your WWCC number is like a driver's licence – the number stays with you and is renewed before it expires. An email or letter is sent to those whose checks are expiring, a reminder to renew.

You can either renew online at: <u>https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check</u>, contact your parish to assist or fill in the renewal form at a Service NSW Centre. Then, visit a Service NSW Centre with proof of identity to complete the renewal process.

After renewal, an email or confirmation letter will be sent with a new expiry date for your WWCC number. Your parish will need to re-verify your renewed WWCC number and new expiry date.

PLEASE NOTE: The Children's Guardian has extended all WWCC clearances that were due to expire from 26 March 2020 to 26 September 2020. An additional six months has been granted from the date of the person's current expiry date. For further assistance, contact: Office of the Children's Guardian on 9286 7276.

Celebration Cake

Carmen Vella, Catechist Coordinator at Our Lady of Victories, Horsley Park shares her go to 'Celebration Cake.' Pentecost is the perfect opportunity to bake a cake, celebrating the birth of the Church!

Ingredients.

200g unsalted butter 2 tbs olive oil 100g pistachios, plus extra chopped to serve 1/2 cup (50g) almond meal 200g caster sugar 200g plain gluten-free flour 1/2 tsp salt 21/2 tsp gluten-free baking powder 150g plain yoghurt 5 eggs, at room temperature 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

Syrup Topping

200g lemon curd 350g mascarpone Finely grated zest and juice of 1 lemon 75g icing sugar, sifted



Method

- Grease and line the base and sides of two 20cm round cake pans with baking paper.
 Preheat oven to 180°C. Melt the butter in a saucepan over low heat.
- 2. Add oil, then remove from heat and set aside to cool. Whiz pistachios in a food processor until very finely ground. Place in a bowl and sift in all the dry ingredients. Make a well in the centre. Add butter mixture, yoghurt, eggs and vanilla, and whisk to make a loose batter.
- 3. Divide batter between pans, then bake for 25 minutes or until golden and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Cool in the pans for 10 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool slightly.
- 4. Meanwhile, whisk the lemon curd and mascarpone in a bowl until thick. Chill until needed. Combine the lemon juice and 25g icing sugar in a pan over low heat, stirring, until mixture is clear. Set aside to cool.
- 5. While cakes are still warm, pierce all over with a skewer, then slowly drizzle 1 tbs lemon syrup over each cake. Set cakes aside to cool completely.
- 6. When cakes are cool, slice each cake in half horizontally so there are four cake layers. Place one cake layer on a plate and spread with one-third lemon curd mixture. Repeat layering two more times, finishing with a final layer of cake.
- 7. Combine remaining icing sugar and lemon syrup to make a thick icing, adding a little water to loosen if necessary. Stir in lemon zest, then drizzle the icing over the cake, letting it drip down the sides. Scatter the chopped pistachios over the cake to serve.
