RESPONSIBILITY

The responsibility for providing Special Religious Education (Catechism) classes in Public Schools sits with the whole Parish community, not just the Parish Priest. Those who are called to serve as a Catechist or Catechist Helper in Public Schools, on behalf of the Parish community, need to be upheld and sustained by the whole community.



- Cardboard candle with each student's first name (not surname) one for each student to be hung / displayed in the foyer of the church.
- Keep a Catechist poster on display in the church. Contact CCD for a copy of posters or down load the poster the <u>CCD Website</u>.
- A display of the Christ our Light and Life curriculum showing the step-by-step lessons may also invite interest.
- Banner with handprints for each student and their first names.
- Display students' work.
- Place a position vacant advertisement indicating schools, days, classes and times in a prominent place in the church.
- · Arrange for Catechists to attend the Masses and actively recruit parishioners.
- Contact parents to invite their public school students to assist at Mass (readings, procession of gifts, handing out notices).
- · Parish Catechists to wear a ribbon, badge and distinctive colour.
- Play the Catechist recruitment video during an agreed time at Mass.

- Place a recruitment notice in the parish bulletin indicating schools, days, classes and times. Include a contact person and telephone number.
- Place in the parish bulletin a short story or catechist reflection on the mission and its value or a reason to become a catechist.
- Advertise CCD Training Courses and In-Service Days in the Parish bulletin and / or the Parish notice-board and also invite parents via public school newsletters.
- Mention the number of Catechists you will need to recruit during this year and report on success / setbacks in subsequent bulletins to show how our parish children are being helped to know and love Jesus.
- Write to any likely candidates who have expressed interest during the year.



- Speak with enthusiasm on the role of the Catechist as a missionary activity proclaiming the Good News. Reinforce information about schools, classes, days and times, as well as contact persons.
- Speak about specific practical support provided by prayer partners, community prayer and community discussion of Catechists' needs and wants for the sake of the children.
- Arrange for a contact person to be available after each Mass to discuss the work of the Catechists and the invaluable, practical training they receive to help faith grow in others.
- Announce the nearest Catechist training course and any orientation days provided by the CCD mention the flexible approach we offer for training that may also benefit the faith of your own family.
- · Invite the Faith Education Officer of your area or CCD Director to speak at your Parish.

PERSONAL APPROACH

- In partnership with the Parish Priest, personally approach parishioners to be part of the mission.
- Primary P&F Committees, playgroup
 parents, Sacramental Prep parents to
 discuss ways of providing support. They
 may be able to become Catechists and/or
 gather resources for use in the classroom,
 baby-sit or provide transport for Catechists
 who need help.

CCD SYDNEY SUPPORT

LEARNING AND PRAYING WITH CHILDREN IS REWARDING - IT KEEPS YOU YOUNG! AND THEY ARE TRIED AND TESTED TECHNIQUES TO HELP YOU. FOR THOSE WHO SERVE AS CATECHISTS OR HELPERS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS, CCD HAS A VARIETY OF SUPPORT TO HELP MAKE THIS MINISTRY MORE EFFECTIVE.

TRAINING COURSES:

Compulsory Training Courses on Safeguarding, Classroom Management and Using the Approved Curriculum are provided for Catechists. These are part of the Level 1 Training Course and must be completed before you start to teach. Level 2 and Level 3 training courses are also available.

RESOURCES: There are a variety of resources available to Catechists from The Mustard Seed Bookshop. Your Faith Education Officer (FEO) will direct you to approved resources.

CLASSROOM ASSISTANCE:

Contact your FEOs who are available to come to your class and assist with any matters that you may be encountering and require help with.

RETREATS AND REFLECTION DAYS:

As part of the spiritual development of the Catechist, CCD provides opportunities for "time out" with God. Such retreat days aim to offer Catechists times to reflect and be especially present to God's continual presence to us.

RECOGNITION:

There are certificates for training and for the years of service that the Catechists have given.
Those who have been a Catechist for five, ten or fifteen years are awarded certificates in Parish ceremonies.

- -Others receive recognition at the Annual Archdiocesan Catechist Mass:
 - Accreditation Awards and Commissioning following completion of training.
- Apostolic Blessing for twenty years,
- Cardinal Freeman Medal for twenty-five years,
- Life Membership Plaque for thirty years,
- Cardinal Gilroy Award for forty-years,
- Saint John Paul II Award for fifty years of service.



APPEAL

- the Good News can be exercised by being a prayer partner, by providing transport, baby-sitting, clerical assistance or by being a catechist or helper in the classroom. Perhaps some people here present may be interested in taking part in the mission to be a public school catechist or to help a catechist. If so, please contact your parish priest, parish catechist coordinator or the CCD Parish Catechist Support Office on 9307 8330.
- New catechists are always needed to continue our parish outreach to support our families with children in public schools.

 Across the Archdiocese, parishes usually recruit up to 300 new Catechists to support those who retire from being a Catechist each year.
- For those who choose to be a catechist, a training program is provided to understand what we teach and how to teach ageappropriately. This training will also help you to support your own children or grandchildren to 'build upon rock' to know and love God, help them make good choices, and benefit from the resilience and deep peace that God wants to give.
- Why not just observe first with one of our experienced Catechists and see what it's like in the classroom?




